1	Hazard – Miscommunication/Misunderstanding Risk – Danger to staff, member of the public and those using the service.	Driver, Passenger, Member of Public, Staff	<ul> <li>All staff and drivers to fully familiarise themselves with the Risk Assessment prior to commencing work.</li> <li>All staff and driver to be fully aware of the Customers Guidelines and Risk Assessments.</li> <li>All staff and driver to be fully aware of the Coach Company Guidelines and Risk Assessments.</li> </ul>	
2	Hazard – Moving Vehicles Risk – Injury or Death because of colliding with a vehicle.	Member of Public, Staff	<ul> <li>All staff working around or near to vehicles are to always wear a hi-visibility jacket.</li> <li>Staff and Members of the Public are to keep to designated footpaths or pavements and always follow any directions whether by signage or by an authorised person.</li> <li>Where necessary, driver or member of staff to assist with providing those disembarking the vehicle with the most appropriate route.</li> <li>Drivers and Staff to follow guidance of Traffic Marshals/Staff when operating within the grounds if these are made available.</li> </ul>	
3	Hazard – Breakdown, Accident, or Incident Risk – Damage to vehicle or third- party property. Injury or Death.	Driver, Passenger, Third Party, Staff	<ul> <li>Driver to be fully aware of the procedures should there be a breakdown, accident, or incident.</li> <li>When able and safe to do so, passengers are to be removed to a place of safety.</li> <li>Driver to ensure, where possible that the hazard warning light are illuminated and that a warning triangle is in situ if one is available on the vehicle.</li> <li>All vehicles to carry a first aid kit and fire extinguisher.</li> <li>Driver or other designated person to be trained in first aid and the use of the fire extinguisher.</li> </ul>	



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			• Driver or other designated person to arrange the appropriate assistance i.e., breakdown provider, emergency services etc	
4	Hazard – Unauthorised Access to Vehicle Risk – Damage to vehicle or third- party property. Injury or Death.	Driver, Passenger, Third Party, Staff	• Driver to ensure that the vehicle is locked and secure when not in use.	
5	Hazard – Vehicle Reversing Risk – Damage to vehicle or third- party property. Injury or Death.	Driver, Passenger, Member of Public, Staff	<ul> <li>Vehicle reversing to be kept to a minimum and only completed when it is safe to do so.</li> <li>Where able, utilise a suitably trained 'banks man' to assist with reversing.</li> <li>Ensure that there are no people walking by the vehicle prior to commencing any manoeuvre.</li> <li>Any staff working around or near to vehicles are to wear a hi-visibility jacket.</li> <li>Drivers and Staff to follow guidance of Traffic Marshals/Staff when operating within the grounds if these are provided.</li> </ul>	
6	Hazard – Slip, Trip or Fall Risk – Injury to self or others.	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>All areas to be clear of any potential hazards and are checked regularly.</li> <li>Any hazards identified should be reported to the driver or other designated person so that appropriate action can be taken.</li> <li>Driver or other designated person to supervise entry and exit of the coach.</li> <li>Only main entrances to the vehicle are to be used. Emergency Exits to be used in an emergency only.</li> </ul>	
7	Hazard – Driver Fatigue Risk – Impairment and risk of injury.	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Coach Company to ensure that the driver is driving the vehicle within regulations and taking the appropriate breaks.</li> <li>Driver to assist with monitoring his hours, breaks and tachograph records.</li> <li>Dual Driver manning where necessary.</li> </ul>	



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8	Hazard – Bodily Fluids Risk – Contamination or Illness	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Suitable cleaning kit and PPE available on-board vehicles to deal with any bodily fluids.</li> <li>Driver or other designated person is suitably trained in the cleaning and disposal.</li> </ul>	
9	Hazard – Overhead Luggage Racks Risk – Injury or Damage	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Only items deemed as 'hand luggage' to be brought on board the coach.</li> <li>Driver or designated person to ensure that a check has been made to ensure items are securely stowed prior to departure.</li> </ul>	
10	Hazard – Obstruction onboard Risk – Injury and impeded exit in emergency.	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Only items deemed as 'hand luggage' to be brought on board the coach.</li> <li>Driver or designated person to ensure that a check has been made to ensure items are securely and appropriately stowed prior to departure.</li> <li>No items to be stowed near the exits of the vehicle.</li> </ul>	
11	<b>Hazard</b> – Spills or Liquid <b>Risk</b> – Injury	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Appropriate cleaning equipment is to be made available on board to clean any spills.</li> <li>It is encouraged that only drinks with lids are brought on board the vehicle.</li> <li>Driver or other designated person is to clean up spills when it is safe to do so.</li> </ul>	
12	Hazard – Safety at other stops Risk – Injury	Driver, Passenger, Member of Public, Staff	<ul> <li>Coach to stop in an approved bay suitable for the size of vehicle. If not available coach to stop in a safe location and activate hazard lights to warn others of their presence.</li> <li>Driver or other designated person to exit vehicle first and check that it is safe and suitable for passenger to exit. Hi-visibility jacket to be work by Driver or another designated person.</li> <li>Driver or other designated to brief passengers prior to exiting the vehicle on safety, luggage collection, entry to destination etc</li> </ul>	
13	Hazard – Manual Handling Risk – Injury or Damage	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Driver or other designated person to load luggage into the luggage compartments.</li> <li>Driver or other designated person to understand how to safely load luggage into the compartments.</li> </ul>	



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14	Hazard – Wheelchair Accessible Coach Risk – Injury or Damage	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Driver is to be fully trained in the use of the wheelchair accessible coach including lifts, safe securing etc</li> <li>Only trained person to operate any equipment in relation to the assistance of a passenger in a wheelchair.</li> </ul>	
15	Hazard – Driver Risk – Injury or Damage	Driver, Passenger, Member of Public, Staff	<ul> <li>Driver is to be familiar with the vehicle they are using.</li> <li>Driver is to be current in his driving licence and able to drive that class of vehicle.</li> <li>Driver is to be current in his Driver CPC Qualifications.</li> </ul>	
16	Hazard – Vehicle Risk – Injury or Damage	Driver, Passenger, Member of Public, Staff	<ul> <li>Vehicle is to be maintained in line with the Driver &amp; Vehicle Standards Agency Guide to Maintaining Roadworthiness for commercial goods and public service vehicles.</li> <li>Vehicle is to be in a clean condition and where necessary regularly cleaned through use.</li> </ul>	
17	Hazard – COVID-19 Risk – Transmission or Illness	Driver, Passenger or Staff	<ul> <li>Current Government Advice is to be followed in respect of COVID-19.</li> <li>A suitable cleaning regime is to be in place between passengers.</li> </ul>	
18	Hazard – Site Unfamiliarity Risk – injury or damage	Driver or Staff	<ul> <li>All staff are to be fully aware of the site that they are visiting prior to arrival.</li> <li>Where staff are not familiar a supervisor or competent member of staff will attend the site to support them.</li> <li>Staff to follow the instructions of the on-site staff and liaise with them for any further necessary information.</li> </ul>	



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19	Hazard – Adverse Weather Risk – injury or damage	Driver or Staff	<ul> <li>Weather forecast is to be checked prior to work commencing to ensure that there is no adverse weather expected.</li> <li>If weather conditions are deemed unsafe all work will be cancelled.</li> <li>Those working in adverse weather will ensure that they have the most appropriate PPE i.e. wet weather clothing.</li> </ul>	
20	Hazard – Staff Fatigue Risk – injury or damage	Staff	<ul> <li>Staff are to take regular breaks throughout the working day.</li> <li>Any work planned is to be done so to allow the safe completion of the work and so as not to rush or cut corners.</li> </ul>
