Mike Heath (MA/PGCE) is an acclaimed playwright with 20 years' experience of writing for the stage, radio, and screen. He has a distinction MA in Creative Writing (Playwriting) and nearly 30 years of teaching experience. He teaches playwriting and screenwriting at degree level and has helped many first-time playwrights establish a career in theatre, TV, and radio.



Vita Fox

Vita Fox is a director, actor and playwright from Manchester, with expertise in comedy and improv. She is Associate Artist at New Adelphi Theatre, one half of comedy duo Fox & Burd, Artistic Director of Happenchance, co-founder of Office Mystery Party, and was Artist-in-Residence at Old Print Works 2018-19. As a performer she was a semi-finalist for BBC Radio's Norman Beaton Fellowship, is a founding member of the Plotbusters improv troupe and the Haven't You Heard improv podcast, and as a theatremaker she was nominated for Edinburgh TV Festival's New Voice Award. Influenced by clowning and improv, Vita's approach is rooted in creating an ensemble, finding the game in the scene, and giving the audience surprising dramatic turning points. Vita has taught several modules and directed various pieces for University of Salford, and loves to support people in developing their vocal techniques, their stage craft, and their acting skills. From an improv perspective, she encourages generosity and play, teaches how to accept and build, how to make each other look good, and how to find the 'points of no return' in a scene. Using contemporary European theatre techniques, her approach experiments with visual storytelling. She encourages her companies to let go of selfjudgment in order to play, and practises rehearsing 'wrong versions' of scenes in order to find surprising gems.

TRAVEL

Students will be picked up from school and dropped off at the start and end of each day, exact times TBC and will be sent over once confirmed. The only time this doesn't apply is for the evening performance, in which you'll stay on campus until the performance and evening event time (6-7.30pm), we'll provide pizza for you to eat during this time so no food will be necessary. Once the performance is over, you'll be free to leave with any parents/carers that have come along to support you to make your way back home.

All costs for the summer school will be covered by Greater Manchester Higher, and all lunches whilst the students are with us will be provided. Pizza will also be provided on the 2nd July after the summer school day sessions end, and the evening performance begins for all students taking part.
